Homework

Homework will be assigned to reinforce and enhance the learning of the students. The assignment will have clear guidelines on how it needs to be accomplished, and students must follow these directions to receive a complete grade for the work. Also, it must be submitted in a timely manner in order to receive full credit. In addition to written assignments, students should read and study on a daily basis in order to keep up with the rigorous class material.

Late Work Policy

Students need to submit assignments on the date that they are due in the beginning of each class period. Late work is highly discouraged. If due to an emergency or extenuating circumstance an assignment is not submitted on time, 10% of the grade will

be deducted for every day that the assignment is late--this includes weekends and holidays. The teacher will determine the last day that the assignment may be submitted in accordance with the unit being taught. It will no longer be considered an emergency or extenuating circumstance if there is a pattern of late submission of assignments.

Content Outline

The world history course is designed to build on the content in the seventh and ninth grade geographical and cultural studies by studying the historical development of these cultures. The course continues the chronological study of ancient world civilizations begun in grade six. After an overview of the Early Ages, the course emphasizes the period from the Middle Ages to the contemporary world. Using the multidisciplinary approach, world history is a balanced program, not just a history of Western Europe. Attention is given to Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America. The host nation's history and culture are used for comparison.
